



## MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

**For the dates of: March 11<sup>th</sup> – March 25<sup>th</sup>, Maidstone RCMP responded to 164 calls for service, some of which include:**

121 provincial traffic offences

### CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- March 24<sup>th</sup> – Call to report a stop sign at highway 21 junction has been knocked over, temporary sign also knocked over. RM office notified.
- March 24<sup>th</sup> - Report of a semi with a flat deck with cable on the back in a large green tank has cable on the back flapping in the wind. No plate obtained. Patrols made by Wilton Police Subject not located.
- March 24<sup>th</sup> – Report of a gold older Jimmy SUV with partial AB marker swerving all over Highway 17 North bound. Patrols made. subject not located.
- March 24<sup>th</sup> - Lloydminster "be on the look out" of a possibly intoxicated driver driving a brown Bronco North on Highway 17. No plate obtained. Patrols made. subject not located.
- March 24<sup>th</sup> - Members received a call of individual would like a person charged for slandering on Facebook. No threats of harm made. Non-criminal.
- March 24<sup>th</sup> - Call of a 2016 black Honda Odyssey broke down on Highway 16. Vehicle is along the shoulder and tow is unable to assist until the next day. The call was just to let the police know. Vehicle was removed the following day.
- March 23<sup>rd</sup> – Members responded to a call in the Marshall area of a 14 yr old who ran away. Member tracked her into Lloydminster. 14 yr old did not wish to return and was left with other family members. No charges were laid.
- March 23<sup>rd</sup> – Call of a semi collided with small truck. Truck was crossing Highway 16 and collided with semi. No injuries, ticket issued to driver of small truck.
- March 23<sup>rd</sup> - Maidstone RCMP received a call asking for advice on leaving relationship. Couple together 8 years. No physical violence. Mental abuse getting worse. Caller is the primary care giver for 2 year old son. Advised to seek parenting order immediately.
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> - 911 call made by mistake from kids playing with the phone.
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> – Another 911 call made by mistake from kids playing with the phone.
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> - Complainant reporting a guy hitchhiking on highway 16 shoulder. Caller stopped to check on him and thinks he is OK. Police not needed. She did not obtain males name or DOB. Weather was sunny and he was dressed for winter. Not suspicious
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> - Report of a vehicle hitting a moose east of Maidstone on Highway 16. Moose is still alive but injured. SERM dispatched.
- March 22<sup>nd</sup> - Mischief call of a landlord in Paynton area threatening the tenant. Complainant was intoxicated and wanted a ride to Lloydminster. No charges
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Members received a call about assault. Members attended. Members spoke with victims and explained options on how to proceed. Members followed up with both when sober. Both declined to proceed with charges. Both agreed to solve matter on the lowest level.
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Maidstone RCMP received a call of an intoxicated person smashing things at residence. Members attended. Subject broke door to complainants' office and a closet door. Nothing physical and not domestic. Not criminal as shared property. Subject of complaint on condition that only allows them to be at residence when complainant allows. SOC left residence. Arrested for breach of peace. Lodged in Cut Knife cells and released when sober.
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Call of a one hit alarm to perimeter bedroom glass break. No answer on site. Members went to residence. No footprints or tracks in fresh snow. One cat seen inside the house. Doors were secured. No signs of forced entry or broken windows. Member spoke with keyholder and updated him.
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Lloydminster RCMP called for assistance with well being check on female. Members checked attended residence. Residence owner had not seen her in 2+ years. Member called Lloyd detachment and updated.
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Lloydminster RCMP requesting assistance with child abuse file. Lloydminster RCMP wanted Members to attend residence in the Lashburn area. Member made contact with the subjects who had no visible signs of bruises or scratches on them. Lloydminster RCMP updated.
- March 21<sup>st</sup> - Call reporting a snow plow had struck the side of a parked semi on the side of the road. No injuries. Snow plow driveable, semi not. Merrit towing came and assisted with tow. Statements to follow. Photos taken.
- March 20<sup>th</sup> - Car westbound on Highway 16 at Lashburn. Police ran plate on the car and the vehicle was registered to a class 7 learner SK DL driver, and only 1 person in the vehicle when police observed it. Police located the

vehicle and female driver did not have her DL with her but identified herself as someone else providing her DOB and the city she lived. Driver told police she had used cannabis the previous evening. Oral Fluid Demand w/driver. Police used SGI to compare photos of the name provided by driver and the registered owner. Police found that the driver was indeed the registered owner, with driver admitting she was lying to police, because she knows she was not to drive alone w/class 7 learner. Oral Fluid provided. POSITIVE -Cocaine. Driver issued 60 Day DL Suspension and Towed/Impounded 3 Days. Driver given courtesy ride to friend/family in Lloydminster, AB.

- March 20<sup>th</sup> - Call to report individual wanted it documented that he thinks his brother took his computer. No information on the computer. Ongoing estate issue. Didn't want police to do anything, just simply documented. Civil issue. No police intervention required.
- March 20<sup>th</sup> - During a collision a semi-truck went through pylons at scene. Witness statement obtained tickets issued. Member was on scene during accident.
- March 20<sup>th</sup> - Members responded to a call in Paynton. An individual went into the residence and took all her jewelry. Still under investigation.
- March 20<sup>th</sup> - Complainant reporting a neighbour in the Lashburn area entered his garage without permission. Complainant declined charges but wanted a file made in case it happens again in the future.
- March 19<sup>th</sup> - Maidstone RCMP received a call that EMS are headed to two vehicle collision at Paynton. One vehicle on fire. Vehicle hit another moving vehicle on Highway 16 eastbound, causing the front vehicle to catch on fire. All 4 people involved (driver of the rear vehicle, and 3 in the first vehicle) taken to hospital. Still under investigation.
- March 19<sup>th</sup> - Call of a man down in the ditch, north of Lloyd on highway 17. EMS attended, Subject attempted to punch EMS, members showed up quickly and arrested subject. He was lodged originally in Lloydminster. EMS examined subject and later transported to Onion Lake cells.
- March 19 - Members responded to a suicidal male driving with a dog in the back, threatening to hurt the dog. Subject of complaint arrested with help from Wilton Police and Lloydminster RCMP.
- March 18<sup>th</sup> - Report of an individual freaking out because he isn't letting his girlfriend in. Members were tied up with several other high priority files, later attended. Girlfriend had already left. Caller advised they just don't like the girlfriend. Not a police matter.
- March 18<sup>th</sup> - Call of a person to be removed from Green Street. Subject was still in residence when Members arrived. Arrested on his warrants from North Battleford. Later released on Undertaking in Maidstone.
- March 18<sup>th</sup> - Complainant came into front counter Maidstone RCMP reporting her Ex -boyfriend, has been contacting her from Saskatoon Correctional center. Subject currently not on any conditions. Complainant provided information to get on no call list.
- March 17<sup>th</sup> - File of theft that happen 7-8 years ago. Caller reports fence posts, wire, and staples were not returned. Caller did not want to get a lawyer if he didn't have to. Civil matter. Member attempted to phone Caller on multiple occasions. Message said call could not be completed.
- March 17<sup>th</sup> - Call for suicidal female in Lashburn area. Caller stated abuse and mental health issues in the family. Members attended and found no signs of abuse or suicidal motives. Members left female to speak to mental health nurse. Nurse stated female was fine.
- March 16<sup>th</sup> - Caller reported a physical altercation at a lease site in Tangle Flags area with another individual. Caller stated he lost his job over it and wanted retribution. Caller was informed the proper process of investigation and decided to proceed civil.
- March 16<sup>th</sup> - C&L Service Center in Lashburn reported a gas and dash involving a white Chevy Silverado. Second time the truck has stolen gas. Surveillance pictures collected. Male youth driver has since been located.
- March 15<sup>th</sup> - Maidstone RCMP received a call that individual snuck out of house overnight and ran away. Subject left his phone and wallet behind. Caller thinks he could be in Lone Rock or Lloydminster with friends. Members found individual in at friend's place. Driven back home.
- March 14<sup>th</sup> - File for sudden death. EMS on scene before Members. Members attended, Subject pronounced deceased. Coroner attended determine natural death. Funeral home attended.
- March 14<sup>th</sup> - Report of a suspicious male walking on a grid road in the RM of Paynton. Unknown who he was, or why he was around. Member called complainant but there was no answer. Caller later called back and updated that the male got picked up and Police no longer required.
- March 12<sup>th</sup> - Securtek had burglary alarm outside Lloyd. 1 hit to ship door at 05:40 hrs. Member spoke with owner at start of shift who confirmed everything secure at business. No concerns.
- March 11<sup>th</sup> - Caller reporting someone went by her house yesterday and knocked on door twice and tried the door handle. Caller answered the second time and told person to leave. Caller concerned for daughter's safety. Caller wanted person spoken to by members. Members spoke to subject and advised to cease all contact.

## TRAFFIC SAFETY

- **March 13<sup>th</sup>** - Drive a motor vehicle without a certificate of registration or a registration permit \$580 fine.
- **March 13<sup>th</sup>** - Operate a vehicle at a speed greater than 35KM over the applicable speed limit \$708 fine.
- **March 11<sup>th</sup>** - Warning issued for Fail to produce a drivers license upon request of a peace officer.
