



## MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

**For the dates of: March 25, 2026 – April 8, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to 152 calls for service, some of which include:**

3 traffic collisions  
134 provincial traffic offences  
5 mischief

### CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- On March 25<sup>th</sup>, a well-being check was called in for a resident in Marshall. Members checked on the person and found that they had already been taken to the hospital for mental health.
- On March 25<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of a semi tire on fire in the R.M. of Britannia. Mechanical issues and members did not attend.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, members received a call of a vehicle in a field, crashed in a bush in the R.M. of Britannia. Vehicle not stolen, beer bottles inside, puke on the inside of the driver door and footprints leading to the road. Vehicle towed by owner.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, the RCMP received multiple calls of a vehicle travelling eastbound in the westbound lane on highway 16. Vehicle located and roadside suspension and tickets issued.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of domestic allegations of abuse on video in the R.M. of Britannia. Members found no evidence of abuse and followed up a few days later.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, members received a call of a semi with duct tape on the window driving erratically on highway 16 near Maidstone. Maidstone RCMP bolo'd North Battleford RCMP but not located.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of an erratic driver. While members searched, the caller stated they were in Lloydminster with erratic driver. Members bolo'd Lloydminster RCMP.
- On March 27<sup>th</sup>, members received a call of a vehicle that had ran out of gas on highway 21 north of Maidstone. Vehicle gone on arrival.
- On March 27<sup>th</sup>, RCMP stopped a vehicle for speeding. Driver stated that he used cannabis the night before and tested positive for THC. A 60 day driving license suspension and ticket issued.
- On March 27<sup>th</sup>, a vehicle was stopped for speeding on highway 21 south of Maidstone. Driver admitted to cannabis use the night before. Driver tested positive for THC. 60 day suspension issued, 3 day impound on the vehicle and vehicle towed and ticket issued.
- On March 28<sup>th</sup>, a resident of the R.M. of Wilton reported that a truck came into his yard, switched drivers, then drove away. Vehicle was doing donuts then drove away on township road 480. RCMP along with a RM of Wilton Police attended but did not locate vehicle.
- On March 28<sup>th</sup>, RCMP members received a call of a completely burned vehicle in the middle of township road 502. Member attended and discovered that the vehicle had been reported stolen the previous night. Vehicle towed.
- On March 29<sup>th</sup>, dispatch received a call of an assault on the side of highway 17 in the R.M. of Britannia. Members from Lloydminster, Onion Lake and Maidstone attended. A female was taken to the hospital and a male was arrested, charged and released on a Release Order.
- On March 29<sup>th</sup>, a call came in of a Dodge Ram travelling westbound in eastbound lanes at a slow rate of speed on highway 16, near Paynton. Members found the vehicle and the driver was arrested and issued a three-day suspension and three-day impound for failing roadside breath test. Vehicle towed.
- On March 29<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of an abandoned vehicle near the lake in Greenstreet, SK. Members attended and found that the vehicle was reported stolen out of Lloydminster. Vehicle towed and statements obtained. Vehicle had been involved in a police chase and abandoned.
- On March 29<sup>th</sup>, police found a Dodge Journey, heading south on highway 21 north of Maidstone, that had been following closely and swerving over the line. RCMP stopped the vehicle and driver failed breath demand. Driver suspended for 60 days, vehicle towed and impounded for three days.
- On March 29<sup>th</sup>, members were called to the sudden death of a 73-year-old male in Lashburn. Coroner and funeral home attended.
- On March 30<sup>th</sup>, Cenovus reported a theft of cable at one of their facilities in Golden Lake.

- On March 30<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a report of a stolen truck and car trailer from a residence in Maidstone. Still under investigation.
- On March 30<sup>th</sup>, a resident of the R.M. of Eldon reported that they had \$36,000 stolen from their bank account. Still under investigation.
- On March 31<sup>st</sup>, a call came in of a roll over on township road 490. Driver swerved to avoid deer. Minor injuries.
- On March 31<sup>st</sup>, members received a call of a suspicious person sleeping in their car in Maidstone. Members attended and found the driver sober and not needing medical attention.
- On April 1<sup>st</sup>, a well-being check was called in for a resident of Maidstone. Female found to be well and caller updated.
- On April 1<sup>st</sup>, a resident of Marshall called to say that someone had gained access to his bank account without his knowledge or approval. No suspects at this time.
- On April 1<sup>st</sup>, SaskEnergy reported copper wire burnt on a site in the R.M. of Eldon. No further damage and nothing stolen.
- On April 1<sup>st</sup>, a resident in the R.M. of Wilton called to report gunshots near his house. Member attended, statement and photos were taken.
- On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, RCMP stopped a speeding vehicle heading south on highway 17. Driver tried to switch seats with passenger and member observed switch. Male driver blew a warning on the ASD. Open alcohol containers in vehicle. Suspension issued.
- On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, RCMP received a call of an ongoing custody dispute in Waseca. No court order in place and Child and Family Services were called in.
- On April 4<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of a semi near Marshall all over the road. Member was in Marshall at the time and tried to intercept but did not locate.
- On April 4<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of a vehicle on highway 774 with no licence plate and driving on shoulder. Members patrolled extensively but did not locate.
- On April 4<sup>th</sup>, an abandoned vehicle left on the travel portion of range road 3280, just north of Lloydminster dump. Vehicle had been involved in a collision with deer. Vehicle towed.
- On April 4<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of semi-automatic shotgun found in the ditch by can pickers. Members attended and gun taken.
- On April 5<sup>th</sup>, RM of Wilton Police located male hitchhiker sitting on the should of Highway 16. RCMP member attended and drove him to Battleford.
- On April 6<sup>th</sup>, RCMP received a call of an unwated person, possibly intoxicated, sitting in the lobby of the bank in Maidstone. Members attended and unwanted person was gone on arrival. Patrols in the area turned up nothing.
- On April 6<sup>th</sup>, RCMP members received a call of a male being verbally aggressive to EMS in Maidstone. Members attended and provided a courtesy ride to the male.
- On April 6<sup>th</sup>, a well-being check was requested for a depressed female in Maidstone. Members attended and put the female in touch with a mental health nurse who set her up with resources.
- On April 7<sup>th</sup>, dispatch received a call of a vehicle shooting a gun out of the sunroof in the R.M. of Britannia. Members attended and found vehicle in Onion Lake. Charges laid.

## TRAFFIC SAFETY

- On March 25<sup>th</sup>, a traffic stop on highway 16 near Maidstone, resulted in the discovery of three cartons of unstamped tobacco. Driver arrested.
- On March 26<sup>th</sup> on highway 16 near Maidstone, a driver was pulled over for speeding. Unstamped tobacco discovered. Driver arrested, ticket issued and verbal warning given.
- On March 31<sup>st</sup>, a traffic member stopped a rental truck near Maidstone. Unstamped tobacco found. Driver arrested and verbal warning provided.

## WANTED

**Brad MILLARD** (50) of Maidstone, Saskatchewan is wanted for two counts of mischief under \$5000-damage to property and failure to appear in court.

**Shawn WHITNEY** (21) of Waseca, Saskatchewan is wanted for theft under \$5000-theft of gas and failure to appear for court.

**Stuart MARTELL**, 36, of Onion Lake, Saskatchewan is wanted for unsafe storage of firearms, carrying a concealed weapon, unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon, possession of firearm/weapon/device ammunition in motor vehicle, adult possession of restricted firearm/prohibited weapon with ammo without licence/registration, fail to comply with release order condition and failure to appear in court.

**Jeffrey MACLEAN** (41) of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan is wanted for operation while prohibited, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal to \$5000, pursuit involved – flight from peace officer, dangerous operation of motor vehicle, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal \$5000, and operation while prohibited.

**Trevor ROSS** (47) of Edson, Alberta is wanted for two counts of possession for the purpose of trafficking, selling of tobacco products and raw leaf tobacco, sell, offer for sale, or have in his possession a tobacco product unstamped and possess, store transport or sell tobacco that is not marked in a prescribed manner, fail to comply with release order condition, and fail to attend court.

**Riley THIESSEN** (49) of Shipman, Saskatchewan is wanted for assault with weapon and mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property.

**Troy CAMPBELL** (35) of Lloydminster, Alberta is wanted for theft under \$5,000, mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property, and fail to attend court x 2.

**Christopher MARFLEET** (39) of Meadow Lake, Saskatchewan is wanted for unauthorized possession of a firearm, unsafe storage of firearms, unauthorized possession of a prohibited weapon or restricted weapon and fail to attend court.

## VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECKS

A vulnerable sector check is a police information check plus a check to see if a person has a record suspension (pardon) for sexual offences. Vulnerable sector checks were created in 2000 to protect children and vulnerable persons and is governed by section 6.3(3) of the [Criminal Records Act](#). Policies and procedures related to vulnerable sector checks can be found in the [Dissemination of Criminal Record Information policy](#) and the *Ministerial Directive Concerning the Release of Criminal Record Information by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police*.

### Employment or Volunteering in the Vulnerable Sector

People who volunteer or are employed in positions of trust or authority over children or vulnerable persons may be required to obtain a vulnerable sector check. **Being in a position of trust or authority is more than having random or chance care and authority with children or vulnerable persons.** To meet the legal requirements for a vulnerable sector check, **the nature of the position** must cause the person to have authority over, or trust of, children or vulnerable persons. A “**vulnerable person**” is defined as any person who, because of age, a disability, or other circumstances, whether temporary or permanent are: in a position of dependence on others or are otherwise at a greater risk than the general population of being harmed by a person in a position of authority or trust.

### Process for getting a vulnerable sector check

The applicant must provide a letter from the organization clearly explaining how a position's duties meet the criteria for a VS check. Each letter is specific to the position and is used for that one application only. It can't be a generic form letter or be used for different positions. Details about the children or vulnerable persons (e.g. age, or other factors that can show how the person is vulnerable). If the position is volunteer, provide a letter from the organization stating the person will not be paid for services or any other personal expenses incurred.

Once the police service has determined that the **position** meets the requirements for a vulnerable sector check, a name-based search will be conducted. In some circumstances, you will be required to submit fingerprints to confirm your identity. The use of fingerprints ensures the accuracy of the identification process.

### Denying vulnerable sector checks

The police service will use information submitted by the applicant to determine if the position meets the legal requirements to conduct a vulnerable sector check. If the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#) for a vulnerable sector check, the vulnerable sector check will not be completed.

### Did you know?

It is an offence to conduct a vulnerable sector check if the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#).
