



MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

For the dates of: April 8, 2026, – April 22, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to 111 calls for service, some of which include:

5 traffic collisions
10 provincial traffic offences

CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- On April 8th members received a third-party report of a stolen cell phone in the Town of Maidstone. When following up with the owner of the phone police were told that it wasn't stolen and they were going to handle it themselves.
- On April 8th in the RM of Wilton a suspicious vehicle was reported driving around lease sites. Members located the vehicle and identified the driver. No offences observed.
- On April 8th in the RM of Britannia members received a report of an abandoned vehicle. Members attended and vehicle not involved in any criminal activity, was in a location safe for users of the highway, and was left for the owner to deal with.
- On April 8th members received a report of a male who called to report that they were thinking about self-harm. Investigation showed that the male was at his home in the City of Lloydminster. Lloydminster RCMP responded and found the caller safe at his home.
- On April 9th members received a call from a female in the RM of Wilton who stated that she had been assaulted by her boyfriend. Members attended and after investigation the male suspect was taken into custody and later released for a future court date.
- On April 9th members responded to an unwanted person complaint in the Town of Maidstone. An adult female was found to be suffering from obvious mental health issues, was taken into custody, and brought to the North Battleford Hospital for evaluation.
- On April 9th members received report of a theft in the RM of Britannia. Investigation determined it to be a civil matter.
- On April 11th members received report in the Town of Maidstone from a woman reporting unknown people knocking on her door and then running away. No description of the suspects provided.
- On April 11th members received a request to assist EMS with a report of an elderly woman in medical distress in the RM of Britannia. Members attended and conducted CPR until EMS arrived. EMS transported the woman to hospital for treatment.
- On April 11th members received a report of an unwanted person at a residence in the Town of Marshall. Investigation showed that there was an intoxicated verbal dispute between a couple that was separating. Situation determined to be a civil matter and no safety concerns were noted.
- On April 12th members received a request to conduct a wellness check on an elderly person living alone in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended, spoke with the occupant, and found no concerns for their safety.
- On April 12th members received report of a damaged vehicle in the RM of Paynton. Caller had left his vehicle parked on the side of the highway after receiving a flat tire. When the caller returned his window was broken and nothing was stolen. There are no further leads or investigational avenues at this time.
- On April 12th members received a report of a child welfare concern in the Village of Waseca. Investigation showed no immediate concern for child safety and matter referred to Child & Family Services for follow-up.
- On April 13th members received a report of a person laying in the ditch on 16Hwy in the RM of Paynton. Members attended and located a male uninjured but suffering from exposure. The male stated that he had been walking and hitchhiking from Regina SK and that he was cold from sleeping in the ditch overnight. EMS called for the male who was taken to hospital for treatment.
- On April 13th members responded to a security alarm at a business in the RM of Wilton. Members attended and found the building secure and received no answer to phone calls to property representatives.
- On April 15th members received a report of a break-in to a business in the RM of Wilton. The caller stated that his fence had been cut and three vehicles entered. Nothing else damaged and only one socket set

was missing. Security video showed a black truck with unknown items in the box, but, the video lacked detail to identify the vehicle. Caller was reporting for information purposes.

- On April 17th members received a request to conduct a wellness check on an elderly person living alone in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended, spoke with the occupant, and found no concerns for their safety.
- On April 18th members received a report of a suspicious vehicle in the RM of Eldon. Members patrolled the area but were unable to locate the vehicle.
- On April 18th members received a report of a horse in the ditch along 16Hwy in the RM of Eldon. Members patrolled the area but did not locate a horse.
- On April 18th members received a report of uttering threats in the Town of Maidstone. Investigation showed that the messages did not reach a criminal threshold. Caller provided with supports and instruction to contact police again should there be any additional contact.
- On April 18th members received a report of an abandoned vehicle on 21Hwy in the RM of Eldon. Members attended and found the vehicle to be off of the driving portion of the roadway with a flat tire. Nothing criminal noted. Vehicle left for owner to resolve.
- On April 19th members received a report of a moose in the Town of Maidstone. Matter referred to SK Conservation.
- On April 19th members received request for assistance from a driver on 17Hwy in RM of Britannia. Driver was travelling into Lloydminster when passenger grabbed the wheel and pulled it attempting to force the vehicle off the roadway. Members attended and determined passenger was suffering from a mental health condition and was transported to the hospital for treatment.
- On April 20th members received a report of an abandoned vehicle in the Town of Marshall. RM of Wilton Police assisted and attended. Owner contacted and advised vehicle had broken down and was making arrangements to have it towed.
- On April 20th members received a report of a suspicious person in the RM of Britannia. Unknown male knocked on a door, asked for direction to Paradise Hill, then left walking east.
- On April 20th members received report of a possible break-in to a commercial property in Maidstone SK. Members attended and nothing appeared to be stolen. Matter is still under investigation.
- On April 21st members received a request for a male in RM of Britannia who may be suffering from mental health issues. Members attended, found the male in no danger, and left in the care of his family.
- On April 21st members received a report from SaskPower that a fence had been cut around their facility in the RM of Wilton. Nothing else was damaged or stolen. There are no leads or investigational avenues at this time.
- On April 21st members received a report from a caller that their vehicle had gotten stuck in a pile of snow "in the country" a month ago and left there. Caller returned and their vehicle was gone.
- On April 22nd members received a report of a dead moose and calf on the side of 16Hwy in RM of Paynton. Call referred to SK Conservation.
- On April 22nd members received report of an abandoned vehicle in the RM of Britannia. Members attended but were unable to locate any vehicle.
- On April 22nd members received a report of a stolen vehicle in the RM of Paynton. The caller had left his vehicle on the side of the highway and when he returned it was gone. Member called around and found the vehicle at Vista Towing. The vehicle had been towed by Dept of Highways as it interfered with snow removal operations as a result of the incoming storm.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

- On April 11th members stopped a driver in the RM of Britannia travelling at 128km/h in a 100km/h zone. Investigation showed that the driver was impaired by THC and a 3-day license suspension was issued.
- On April 13th members received a report of 7-8 cows beside the road in the RM of Eldon. Members attended, located the loose cattle, and located the owner. Cattle safely returned to pen.
- On April 14th members received an iPhone crash notification to a location in the Town of Maidstone. Members attended and found no collision. Members were able to contact the owner of the phone who confirmed that there was no emergency and that he had dropped his phone.
- On April 17th members attempted to stop a vehicle on 17Hwy in the RM of Britannia that was travelling at 127km/h in a 100k/h zone. The vehicle accelerated and continued driving. The vehicle was later located abandoned in Onion Lake and the driver identified. Vehicle impounded and several traffic tickets were issued.

- On April 18th members responded to a report of a vehicle in the ditch in the RM of Wilton. Witness reported that the driver was asleep in the vehicle. Members attended and found nothing criminal had occurred.
- On April 18th members responded to report of a vehicle in the ditch beside 16Hwy in the RM of Wilton. Members attended and found a vehicle submerged in water and the driver on the roadway uninjured. Driver stated that a fast-moving semi-truck was coming up behind him, he was worried about being rear-ended, and he took evasive actions ending up in the ditch. Investigation showed that the driver was not intoxicated.
- On April 19th at 1:35PM members received a call from a driver who had broken down on 16Hwy in the RM of Paynton. The driver was on the shoulder of the road, had called for a tow truck, but was worried about being hit and wanted police to park behind him with lights on for safety. Members were tied up with other matters and did not attend.
- On April 20th members received a request from a SK Conservation Officer to assist with a traffic stop in the RM of Britannia. CO had stopped a vehicle and found that the driver had a warrant for their arrest, neither occupant had a license, and there was an unrestrained child. Members attended, warrant executed, tickets issued, and vehicle towed.

WANTED

Brad MILLARD (50) of Maidstone, Saskatchewan is wanted for two counts of mischief under \$5000-damage to property and failure to appear in court.

Shawn WHITNEY (21) of Waseca, Saskatchewan is wanted for theft under \$5000-theft of gas and failure to appear for court.

Stuart MARTELL (36) of Onion Lake, Saskatchewan is wanted for unsafe storage of firearms, carrying a concealed weapon, unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon, possession of firearm/weapon/device ammunition in motor vehicle, adult possession of restricted firearm/prohibited weapon with ammo without license/registration, fail to comply with release order condition and failure to appear in court.

Jeffrey MCLEAN (41) of Lloydminster, Saskatchewan is wanted for operation while prohibited, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal to \$5000, pursuit involved – flight from peace officer, dangerous operation of motor vehicle, possession of property obtained by crime less than or equal \$5000, and operation while prohibited.

Trevor ROSS (47) of Edson, Alberta is wanted for two counts of possession for the purpose of trafficking, selling of tobacco products and raw leaf tobacco, sell, offer for sale, or have in his possession a tobacco product unstamped and possess, store transport or sell tobacco that is not marked in a prescribed manner, fail to comply with release order condition, and fail to attend court.

Riley THIESSEN (50) of Shipman, Saskatchewan is wanted for assault with weapon and mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property.

Troy CAMPBELL (35) of Lloydminster, Alberta is wanted for theft under \$5,000, mischief under \$5,000 – damage to property, and fail to attend court x 2.

VULNERABLE SECTOR CHECKS

A vulnerable sector check is a police information check plus a check to see if a person has a record suspension (pardon) for sexual offences. Vulnerable sector checks were created in 2000 to protect children and vulnerable persons and is governed by section 6.3(3) of the [Criminal Records Act](#). Policies and procedures related to vulnerable sector checks can be found in the [Dissemination of Criminal Record Information policy](#) and the *Ministerial Directive Concerning the Release of Criminal Record Information by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police*.

Employment or Volunteering in the Vulnerable Sector

People who volunteer or are employed in positions of trust or authority over children or vulnerable persons may be required to obtain a vulnerable sector check. **Being in a position of trust or authority is more than having random or chance care and authority with children or vulnerable persons.** To meet the legal requirements for a vulnerable sector check, **the nature of the position** must cause the person to have authority over, or trust of, children or vulnerable persons. A “**vulnerable person**” is defined as any person who, because of age, a disability, or other circumstances, whether temporary or permanent are: in a position of dependence on others or are otherwise at a greater risk than the general population of being harmed by a person in a position of authority or trust.

Process for getting a vulnerable sector check

The applicant must provide a letter from the organization clearly explaining how a position's duties meet the criteria for a VS check. Each letter is specific to the position and is used for that one application only. It can't be a generic form letter or be used for different positions. Details about the children or vulnerable persons (e.g. age, or other factors that can show how the person is vulnerable). If the position is volunteer, provide a letter from the organization stating the person will not be paid for services or any other personal expenses incurred.

Once the police service has determined that the **position** meets the requirements for a vulnerable sector check, a name-based search will be conducted. In some circumstances, you will be required to submit fingerprints to confirm your identity. The use of fingerprints ensures the accuracy of the identification process.

Denying vulnerable sector checks

The police service will use information submitted by the applicant to determine if the position meets the legal requirements to conduct a vulnerable sector check. If the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#) for a vulnerable sector check, the vulnerable sector check will not be completed.

Did you know?

It is an offence to conduct a vulnerable sector check if the position does not meet the requirements of the [Criminal Records Act](#).
