



MAIDSTONE RCMP REPORT

For the dates of: May 21st, 2026 – June 3rd, 2026, Maidstone RCMP responded to 143 calls for service, some of which include:

30 provincial traffic offences
4 vehicle collisions

CALLS FOR SERVICE:

- May 21st – Report of neighbor not returning property from 8 years ago in the RM of Eldon. Civil matter that had been reported to police before.
- May 21st – Report of abandoned vehicle in the RM of Wilton. Located and belonged to oilfield worker in area.
- May 21st – Male reported being extorted. Still under investigation.
- May 21st – RM of Britannia reported an illegal encampment near Lloydminster. Members attended and confirmed location which will be dealt with at a later date.
- May 21st - Report of lost licence plate. Unknown when and where it went missing.
- May 21st – Report of a window being broken in the Town of Marshall. Appeared a BB had been shot at the window. No witnesses or video surveillance.
- May 21st – Female reported church music coming from inside her residence in the Town of Maidstone. Members checked the house and determined the neighbors had somehow connected to the wrong blue tooth speaker.
- May 22nd – Trailer on fire in Waseca. Nothing suspicious.
- May 22nd – Male laying in the ditch near Sandy Beach. Male was located and picked up by a family member.
- May 22nd – Female apprehended on mental health warrant in Lashburn. Driven to Battleford hospital.
- May 22nd – Commercial alarm in Maidstone. Member attended. False alarm.
- May 23rd – Landlord/Tenant issue in the RM of Britannia. Nothing criminal occurring and advice provided on how to proceed.
- May 23rd – Male reported his cellphone taken from the Lashburn bar. Phone was tracked to rural address. Property rep allowed Members to check the property. Phone was located but it could not be determined who stole it or brought it to the property.
- May 24th – Report of children playing in traffic in Marshall. Member attended and spoke with the parents.
- May 24th – Female reported she had an argument with her husband in Lashburn. Members met with the female and determined nothing criminal occurred.
- May 25th – Suspicious vehicle near the Lloydminster Upgrader. Vehicle located. Vehicle was being driven into SGI but ran out of gas.
- May 25th – Abandoned vehicle on private property at Sandy Beach. Member attend but vehicle had already been moved.
- May 25th – Suspicious vehicle in the RM of Britannia. Vehicle located and couple told to move along.
- May 26th – Report of male and female sleeping in ditch in the RM of Wilton. Both were gone when Members arrived.
- May 26th – Vehicle spotted on Highway 17 north of Alcurve which possibly had a rifle pointed out the window. Multiple Members did patrols in the area but did not locate the vehicle. Not enough information to proceed further.
- May 26th – Car caught on fire on Highway 17 near Sandy Beach. Driver was able to stop and get out of the vehicle. Caused by mechanical issues.
- May 26th – Report of break and enter in Paynton. Property owner had been away for extended period and came home to find house ransacked. Still under investigation.
- May 26th – Male reported he had purchased a snowmobile and helmet back in January but he never got the helmet. Civil matter.
- May 27th – Male sleeping in the ditch near Marshall. Male located and provided a courtesy ride.
- May 27th – Male wearing a safety vest jumping into traffic near Waseca. Members checked but no one located.
- May 27th - Complaint of family member defrauding male of \$60,000. Occurred in the RM of Wilton. Still under investigation.

- May 28th – Female reported mother bear and cubs on her front lawn in the RM of Britannia preventing her from leaving. SERM notified.
- May 28th – Tractor fire in the RM of Britannia. Nothing suspicious.
- May 28th – Two vehicle collision on Highway 17 at Sandy Beach. Car had stopped due to heavy rainfall and was rear ended by a semi. No injuries. Car towed.
- May 29th – Report of dead moose on Highway 16 East of Maidstone. While Members were enroute a vehicle hit the dead moose causing the car to be disabled. Vehicle towed. No injuries.
- May 29th – Domestic dispute in Maidstone. Both parties had assaulted each other. Both were charged and placed on no contact conditions.
- May 29th – Report of gun shots in Lashburn. Members attended and determined it was fireworks.
- May 30th – Male in Lashburn reported receiving threatening messages from a known party. Investigation found both parties were slandering each other. Both have been instructed to cease all contact.
- May 30th – Report of an illegal encampment behind a business near Lloydminster. RM of Britannia already aware and are working to solve the issue.
- May 30th – Custody dispute in Paynton. Members spoke with all parties and mediated a solution.
- May 31st – Members advised of male wearing a police coat in the RM of Britannia. Male was located and police markings removed from coat. Male stated he had got the coat at the good will in Edmonton. Nothing criminal.
- May 31st – Mental health call in Waseca. Female was located and apprehended under the mental health act. Female was brought to Battleford where she was held for evaluation.
- June 1st – Abandoned vehicle on Highway 17 which was high centered in the construction zone. Members were told the occupants had been intoxicated but had already been picked up. Vehicle towed.
- June 1st – Theft of power cords from the asphalt plant near Lashburn. The company had shut down due to rain and when an employee returned all the heavy power cords had been stolen. Approximately 500 feet of 3 inch cord missing.
- June 3rd – Casings from copper cable located dumped in the RM of Wilton. Size not consistent with local thefts. Still under investigation.
- June 3rd – Roll over on Highway 16 East of Marshall. Driver showed signs of impairment. Breath sample resulted in a fail. Driver was brought for breath samples but refused to provide samples. Driver was charged accordingly.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

- May 22nd – Members doing proactive vehicle stops in Maidstone stopped a truck. Mandatory breath sample resulted in a warn and driver was given a 7 day driving suspension.
- May 23rd – Vehicle stopped near Silver Lake for the driver holding a cellphone. Mandatory oral fluid demand given which resulted a positive hit for THC. Driver issued a 7 day suspension. Ticket issued for holding cellphone which is a \$580 fine.
- June 2nd – Member on patrol near Highway 17 located speeding car doing 183km/h. Mandatory breath sample resulted in a fail. Driver provided breath samples at the Lloydminster detachment of 140mg% and 130mg%.
